Meeting Ed Wynn Leaves One Silly

The Perfect Fool is just what he is. No one will deny Ed Wynn that title. No one could possibly keep up the fast pace this King of Jesters sets even after 47 years of show business. It's amazing, but even more noteworthy when we



learn that this man of many costumes and gimmicks is out to upset television.

Wynn will be seen by Chicagoans for the first time on channel 4 this Thursday. He's a CBS-TV star now, anxious to show everyone

his collection of 800 silly hats.

Grandma Cooper tells me she can remember seeing the Fool first step behind the footlights in 1902 in Norwich, Conn., where he played a 70-year-old clergyman for \$12 a week in "Jim Bledsoe," a famous stock play in the 10, 20 and 30 cent repertoire. His duties also included passing out handbills to attract crowds to the company's performance in the New England states.

"With one of my throwaways, a lady could get in to see my performance for only 10 cents," Wynn recalls. "Otherwise she'd have been charged 20 cents."

It was in 1916 he reached full stardom in "The Passing Show of 1916," and from that point on the Fool played in 16 Broadway shows over a period of 27 years, dovetailing a radio career into his stage schedule.

But after spending an hour or so with Ed Wynn, listening to his many funny stories, I felt a bit silly myself. The guy's contagious!

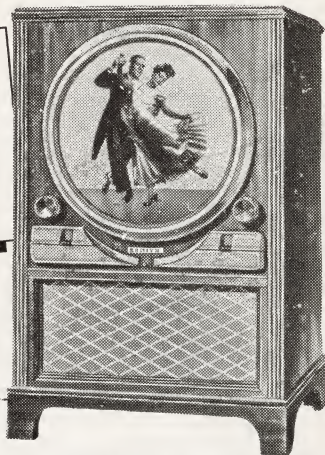

Before-the-show warmups at the organ (left center) are often taken with Don Heaps. In this picture are Miss





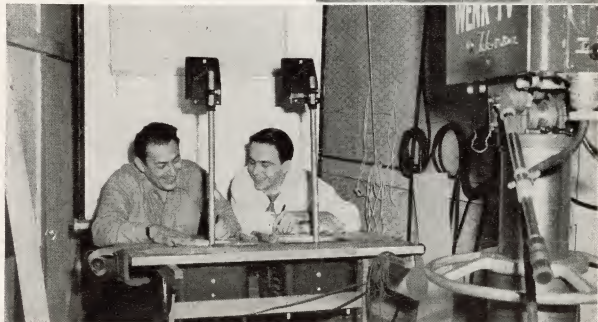

PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED WORKERS SALUTED by WGN-TV's news-reel last week resulted in this interesting photo. Chicago viewers saw and heard a feature story filmed at the U.S. Naval Ordnance Plant in Forest Park, where important jobs are held by men in spite of disabilities.

Pictures are sometimes deceiving and here's a case in point. Seven employees of the Naval Ordnance Plant listen intently while Charles S. Gekler, WGN-TV photographer, explains the operations of his motion picture camera. Four of the seven have but one leg, two but one arm and the other suffers from paralysis of both hips as an aftermath of a long siege of polio. In spite of the disabilities, the men are among nearly 200 physically impaired persons who are employees.

Leg amputee, Clarence M. Mercer, of 936 Home Avenue, Oak Park (second from left), Gerald Ripley of 245 S. 21st Avenue, Maywood (extreme right), and Bernard Lewin of 2518 Elm Street, River Grove and John Dziergas of 2418 S. Hamlin, Chicago, all lost limbs in World War II combat and wear artificial legs.

Irwin T. Scholle, of 430 S. Monterey, Valla Park, lost his left arm in a childhood mishap and is unable to wear an artificial appendage, while Raymond Ruzalski, of 2251 W. 19th Street, Chicago, who suffered loss of his right arm during the closing weeks of ETO combat in World War II, wears an artificial arm.

Polio's ravages threatened to prevent Jack Howes, of 201 S. 19th Avenue, Maywood (second from right), from ever walking again after he was strick-

en in the Philippine Islands during World War II but with the assistance of a cane the husky Ordnance Worker moves about and finds the paralysis no impediment in his dispatch of bench duties at the plant.

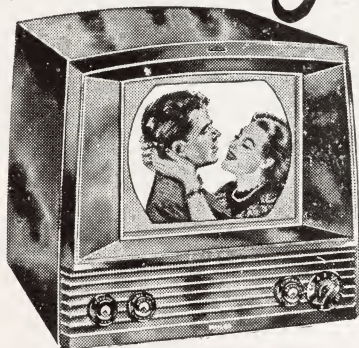

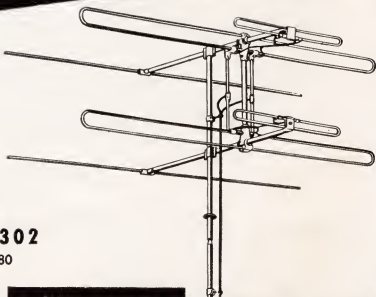

"What is Art All About?" Gnagy Asks— TV Instructor Works Out Synthesis

Jon Gnagy, WNBQ art instructor, this week told us a number of Chicago viewers following his suggestions have developed from tyro doodlers to comparatively formidable pen-and-brush men.

Gnagy, who can be seen on channel 5 in "You Are An Artist," has been teaching art long before TV, and even now in addition to his show he conducts classes in Columbus Circle, New York.

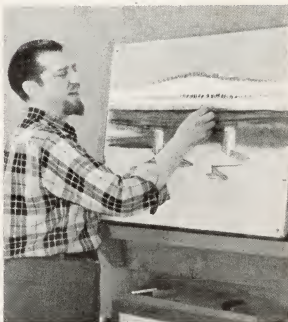
Despite his name and the goatee that has made his face familiar to thousands of video viewers, Gnagy's story is typically American. Born in 1907 near Pretty Prairie, Kansas, Gnagy was the son of a farmer, hardware merchant and cabinet maker.

Though he had no formal instruction in art, his interest in it developed early, and he was soon illustrating his school publications. After leaving school, he entered commercial art, and after a number of years with agencies he left Kansas for New York. That was in 1931.

It was not exactly a period of lush economic activity that Gnagy has chosen for his invasion of the East. That, plus the fact that his family then numbered two children, led him to return to the field of commercial art. Here he was again spectacularly successful, and in the early '40's he was able to open his own consulting service, specializing in poster and packaging design. During the war he applied his knowledge to the development of camouflage techniques.

But again Gnagy began asking himself questions about art, and again he found that the answers escaped him. "What," he asked, "is art all about?"

It was not a simple question to answer. He delved into physics, psychology, philosophy and biology. "I couldn't find the answers I wanted in the words of the critics with their artistic double-talk, but I did find them in a study of the correlated sciences," he says. Burning with a desire to digest his research, he moved to Palm Springs, California, where he supported himself and his

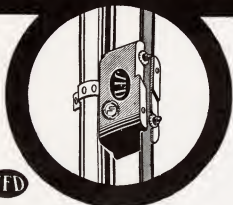


family by painting signs and doing other odd jobs, while his wife contributed her share by working in a hospital laboratory.

"I sat down and wrote out all the words I knew about art," Gnagy continues. "They didn't fit into anything I had ever read about art, but into science. I developed a chart which traces the creative process in the human mind, the expression of an inner feeling evoked by one's impressions of the material world, the expression of feelings and ideas beyond the level of words in terms of line, shape, form, color, value and texture."

Gnagy realized that a full utilization of his chart and the theory behind it would expedite the process of realization and achievement on the part of beginners in their attempts to draw and paint. His first attempt at applying his theory on a beginner was with a prominent woman summer resort executive who was in California recuperating from fatigue. The results were amazing, not only in terms of art but of therapy. She induced him to return East and teach at her resort, and again the Gnagy system worked with such success that he felt ready to open a school in New York.

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Will TV Affect the Motion Pictures? These Men Say Yes

Many Chicagoans differ in the discussion of the future of TV and the motion picture industry. With the question, "How Will Television Affect the Motion Pictures?" asked of radio network officials, screen stars, picture directors and tele-set manufacturers, the major conclusion reached is that each industry will continue to flourish side by side.

Paul Raiborn, Paramount pictures executive, says: "We have learned that during the first few months after a television set comes into the house, radio listening practically disappears while television is on, and that all other forms of relaxation and amusement, including automobile riding and the reading of books, magazines and newspapers, decreases 20 to 30 percent."

Says Walter Abel, chairman of the Screen Actors Guild TV committee: "Whereas the public bought its entertainment wherever it chose, and whatever kind it chose, television will now give it free. This is the revolution in show business, visual entertainment, paid for by advertising."

Mark Woods, President of ABC and WENR-TV, Chicago, says: "Television can affect motion pictures adversely if the movies ignore it, disregard its vast potentialities, miss its challenge, for television does offer to the motion picture industry one of the greatest challenges it has ever had. Today the television industry looks to the motion picture field to provide it with a large part of the vast quantity of entertainment which television needs.

"Television will most certainly offer strong and constant competition for audience attention. That will be a challenge to Hollywood to produce better pictures," Mr. Woods adds.

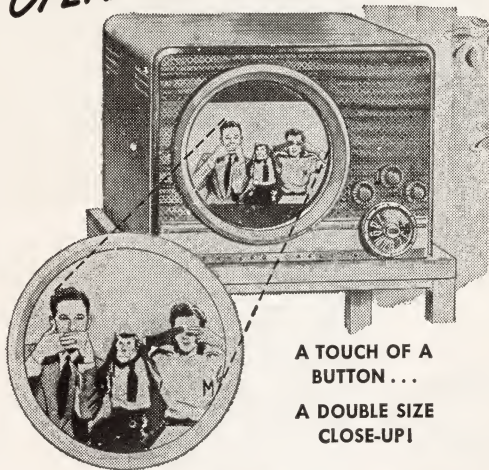

Britons Pay \$8 Tax, But Enjoy Telecasts Free of Commercials

By BETTY JANE STEARNS

To the children of the American Advertising Age it comes as something of a surprise that nothing is packaged at the Television home at Alexandra Palace. Nothing, that is, except good entertainment.

No scripts lie at the mercy of advertisers, no British children worry about what little Orphan Annie will do after her next glass of Ovaltine, and no one knows the terror of missing a giveaway phone call.

Average Mr. and Mrs. John Bull, who own one of London's 150,000 TV sets sit down to watch their favorite programs in front of a machine that looks much like yours, and receive a picture that is just as clear (American definition is 450 lines, British 405 lines).

However, beyond the price of the TV set, Britons pay \$8 a year for a video receiving license! The most surprising thing about British TV is not that telecasting covers only about three hours daily, but that BBC-TV does not plan to increase its schedule.

Alexandra Palace is no cradle for the animation of Portia facing life, and the TV owners of Great Britain are not expected to wash, iron, read the the evening paper, or belch at the screen between bridge hands, whisky and tap water.

"We sit down to television," said one BBC-TV spokesman, "We make an occasion of it. It is hard enough for us to plan three hours of *good* entertainment a day, without attempting to schedule a full 12 hour program such as you Americans attempt."

Telecasting from Alexandra Palace includes one hour in the morning between 10 and 11, given over to demonstration for the radio business; an hour between 3 and 4; and in the evening an hour and one-half between 8:30 and 10.

Programs are planned for a proper balance of comedy, drama, music, outside broadcasts, and talks. An interesting weekly schedule is the work of some 25 regular directors and a substantial

number of guests. BBC-TV presents from two to three full-length plays each week, and finds that these productions are probably the most popular of their programs.

About a fifth of telecasting time is taken up with sporting events such as cricket matches and tennis at Wimbledon. BBC-TV's telecast of the Olympic games naturally made international news, and they are constantly experimenting to perfect these outside events. The Thames boat races were covered this year by what BBC thinks are the "World's first floating cameramen."

Highlighting last month's schedule was the live transmission of the *Marquis de Dievas Ballet*, a well-known European troupe that had just finished a successful Covent Garden engagement. Unfortunately the production of such spectacles is hampered by the problem of space at Alexandra Palace. Neither of BBC-TV's two studios were large enough to house both dancers and orchestra, so that the conductor was forced to synchronize music and dancing via a concealed TV receiver he used as a monitor!

There is little doubt, however, that despite the physical drawbacks of Alexandra, the quality of British television is at all times on a level and frequently superior to the US brand. With the philosophy of good entertainment for the sake of good entertainment—what a difference between our goal of entertainment for the sake of soap or coal—and with talented directors and actors they cannot help but surpass us.

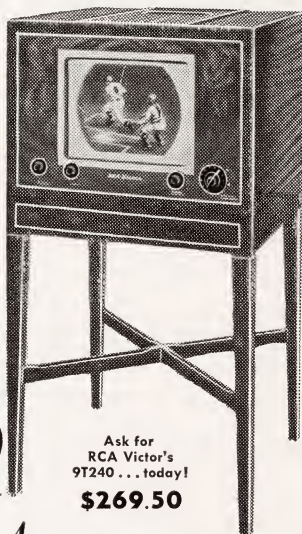

pulse to tamper with brightness, clearness, focus or volume. If, after 60 minutes, the picture still appears excessively bright or morbidly dim, and your eyeballs have rolled back into your head, grope your way to the door. Carefully avoid marring of furniture.

3. REFRESHMENT. Under no circumstance will the proprietor of the family, or her husband, be shamed or subverted into injecting a coarse material aspect into the entertainment by serving

any form of liquid nourishment. The shaker is conveniently located beneath the mess of squeezed limes in the kitchen.

4. COMPARISONS. We have no pathological interest in the names, makes, or locations of TV sets that a) have larger screens, b) produce clearer pictures, or c) are easier on the eyes. Of this set we simply state 1) it has been installed, 2) it has been paid for, 3) it hides perfectly the large dent in the wall left by your children during that recent visit.



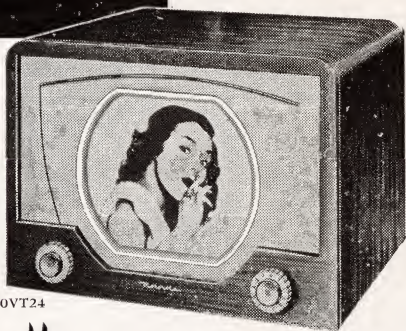

GETTING IN

The Last Word

By CHUB MCCARTHY

Been wondering how much to pay for TV service?

After hearing of a few isolated cases where some over-eager gyp boys (now out of business) charged sky-high rates for an average installation, old man McCarthy got mad and decided to investigate conditions for himself.

You can do the same, if you have weeks to spend. Here's what I found out. First I put the names of more than a dozen TV service houses in a hat, closed my eyes, and picked out one. It was Tower Television Service at 3901 North Neva, a typical service company. I learned this bit of information after checking and rechecking. Found out the average house call runs about five bucks, including the first hour of service. Only experienced TV men are sent out.

Good servicemen make it a practice to check your warranty data on cash calls. If they carry a 1 year service policy with the customer, all parts are replaced at no charge, including the picture tube!

Outside installations of antennae usually run around \$25 in Chicago, about \$35 in the suburbs, including antenna and instructions to the owner. Inside installations average \$5, however this price does not include the antenna.

You should expect good service from the TV service company in your neighborhood. The men are usually on the job until 9 p.m. each evening, and like everyone else would like Sundays off, but in extreme emergencies—which you and I have experienced—top flight organizations will come to your rescue. It pays to get good service. It means only one thing: enjoyment of your video receiver.
