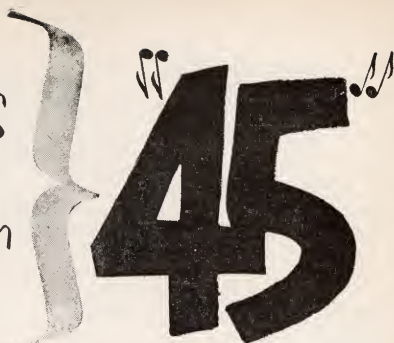

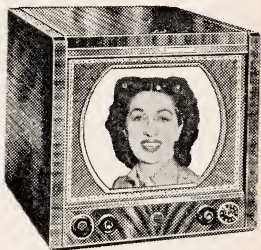

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Color Decision May Mean More Stations

The recent decision by the FCC, authorizing the CBS system of color for television (now being contested in the courts) will probably speed up the possibilities of Chicago gaining three additional video stations.

Wayne Coy, FCC Chairman, told this magazine that in April, 1951 the commission hopes to process applications for existing channels throughout the country.

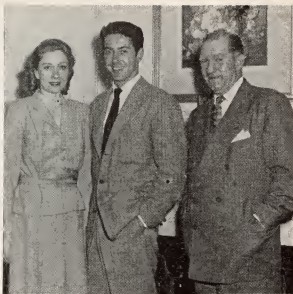
In Chicago that means TV viewers will, within the next 12 months, be given a choice of more programs, local and network. Whichever companies are given permission to operate commercial stations must convince the commission they will operate in the interest of the public.

Whereas the freeze on new construction kept back the erection of more stations, the government commission will not limit the hearing to firms whose applications were submitted at the time of the freeze. Therefore, you as an individual or company or organization, can apply for such a permit. If you can financially satisfy the staggering figure it takes to build a transmitter, you may be approved.

More stations means more entertainment, more work for TV actors, actresses, stage hands, and technicians.

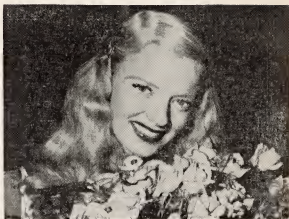

"Simmer in a 350 degree F oven without a lid for a half hour to 45 minutes. Then turn the oven to 250 degrees and simmer for another 45 minutes. That's it, and I guarantee it will satisfy," concluded Mary.

Although her cooking has never brought any blue ribbons (mainly because she hasn't entered any contests, her friends insist), Mary's beauty and personality have brought many honors

When Mary left Hillsboro, Ill., to become a model and to further her music career in Chicago, she had just graduated from high school. She'd done some singing, won the state trumpet championship, been elected Beauty Queen of Hillsboro high, was a cheerleader and had gained the school's applause as leading lady of the senior play.

Shortly after arrival in Chicago, Mary took up the baton on ABC's "Junior Junction." It wasn't long, either,

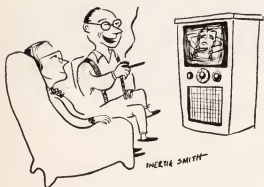
before her date book was filled with modeling appointments—the envy of her Chicago co-beauties.

Courage accompanied her charm and beauty in those days, too, for in the spring of 1946 she was forced to smile through a siege of polio, leaving her with the determination to make good once again in her dual aspirations. And she did!

When the American Broadcasting Company opened its Chicago television facilities and Super Circus was innovated, producers looked for something different as a bandleader to guide the big top tempo. They saw Mary, and that was it—talent and a TV natural. She started with the show in September, 1948, and has remained its baton queen since.

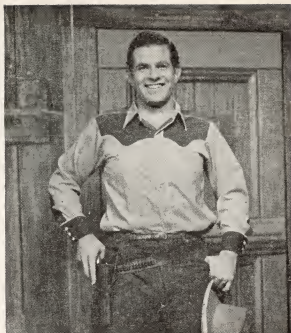
After being swarmed by worshipping children during the past two years, ABC officials decided to give Mary her own show on which she would entertain moppets. Thus, the birth of the Mary Hartline Show, presented over WENR-TV each Monday-through-Friday from 5 to 5:15 p.m.

In spite of her success, the talented and lovely Mary Hartline still holds with the philosophy of life suggested to her by her mother when she left Hillsboro for a career in Chicago: "If you think good and beautiful thoughts, they will be transmitted to those around you. . . ."

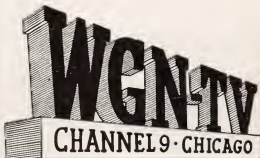

Chicago boxing fans and TV viewers will be treated to another national ranking ring show Wednesday, Nov. 8, when "Sugar" Ray Robinson and Bobby Dykes battle in a 10 rounder at the Chicago Stadium. The bout will be telecast on Channel 4, WBKB.

Robinson, considered by experts as the best boxer, pound for pound, in the ring today, is faced with a problem of finding opponents in his weight class. He's taking on middleweights and has even talked of fighting Ezzard Charles for the heavyweight title. (Bob Fitzsimmons performed that feat at the turn of the century weighing 168 pounds.)

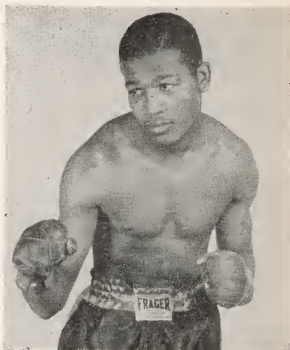
Along with the Robinson match is another great supporting card. Tony Spano and Jimmy LaCassa are billed in a semi-windup of eight rounds. With supporting cards of that caliber, television shouldn't hurt the IBC gate. Spano has rolled up 15 victories in 18 fights. LaCassa is undefeated. Both boys are from the west side of Chicago to give it a local flavor.

However, Robinson continues to be the main attraction. "Sugar" has won all but one of his 115 professional fights. His only defeat came at the hands of Jake LaMotta, whom he later trounced three times.

"Sugar" was born Walker Smith. He changed his name one night after losing a close amateur bout. "I never want Smith to lose again," said Robinson. He didn't as an amateur. Marty Servo, welterweight champ, abdicated his throne in 1946 so that he wouldn't have to fight Robinson for the title.

With the advent of TV in this match, promoters all over the U. S. and abroad are watching the attendance figures of the current schedule of International Boxing Club matches. The recent poor gates are blamed on TV. Following Robinson will be another telecast of Joe Louis; if these two outstanding boxers fail to draw, the sport surely will become divorced from all future telecasts.

Handsome, neat in appearance and the kind of fellow you would invite into your own home to enjoy dinner and an evening of entertainment with your wife and kids. That's a partial description of Frankie Talaber, formerly of Chicago and now a full-fledged resident of Columbus, Ohio. Often seen over WENR-TV, Frankie doesn't think wrestling will fall out of the sports picture. "Wrestling fans are the most loyal fans in sports. There will be many a squawk if they stopped televising wrestling shows," said Frankie.

Talk of wrestling, and the game itself surrounded him before he was able to walk. He's the son of Lou Talaber, one time middleweight champion, who taught Frankie many of the fine points of wrestling.

Born in Chicago, he attended St. Michael's Grade School. While at Lane Tech High School, he won the City and State high school wrestling championships, the 115, 125, and 145 pound divisions in 1925-26- and 27. He then entered Armour Institute of Technology (now called Illinois Tech.). In two years at Armour, Frankie was undefeated and spent some time coaching the wrestling team as well.

He went to Northwestern University on scholarship, studied electrical engineering—and remained undefeated as a collegiate wrestler. In 1936, Frankie turned pro and won the Illinois State title, as recognized by the Illinois State Athletic Association. He then moved on to El Paso, Texas, and Mexico to cop titles at both places.

He became the world's lighthheavyweight champ in 1938 and held the title until 1940 when he outgrew the division and entered the new junior heavy-weight division which he rules in six states.

Frankie's submission hold is the deadly pile driver. The object of this hold is to see how far you can drive your opponent's head into the ring boards.

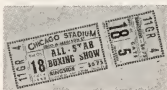

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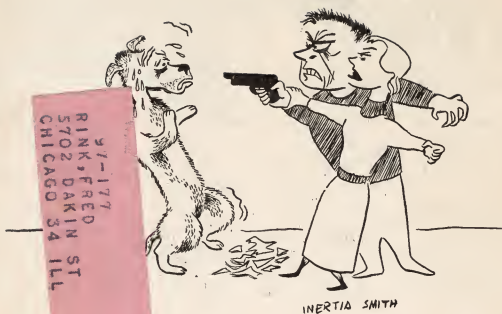
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
