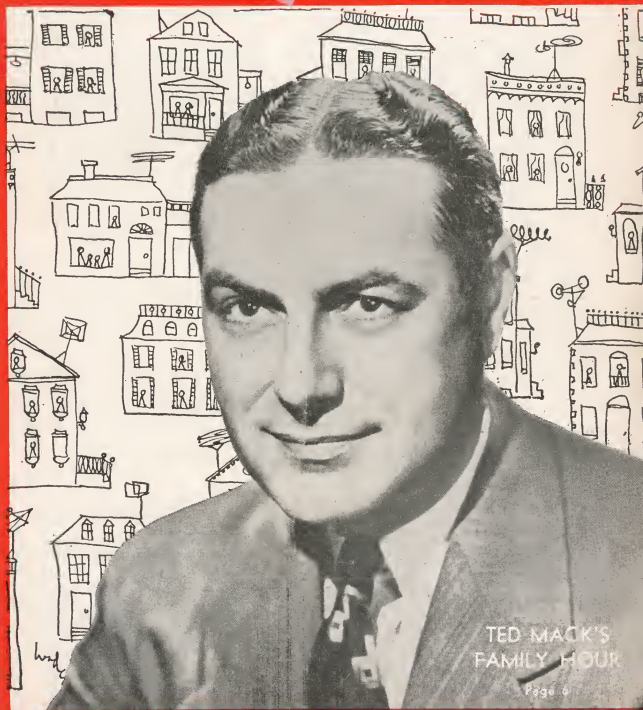

Sunday afternoon generally finds the American family sprawled about the living room in assorted positions of soporific bliss. In recent months, however, ABC has noticeably perked up this mass drone session with a warm, vibrant TV show called "Ted Mack's Family Hour."

Pleasant

Beamed on channel 7 at 5 p.m. each week, the "Family Hour" is a pleasant 60 minute program of variety acts presided over by one of America's handsomest emcees.

Headman Ted Mack, who incidentally was born William E. Maguiness and shortened his name for theatrical reasons, stages his weekly offering in the grand old tradition of the late Major Bowes. This means a casual, relaxed performance.

However, no amateurs are used. Instead, such headline talents as the Mack Triplets, dancer Johnny Coy, whistler Minda Lang, actress Jean Stell and blind soprano Gladys Watts, are featured from time to time.

Triplets

Many Chicagoland fans are understandably confused over the similarity in names between Ted and the singing Triplets. The girls, whose names are Eileen, Charlotte and LaVerne, are no relation to Ted Mack, but are actually sisters. They were born in Baltimore, schooled in Washington and started show business in New York.

The show is sponsored by Swanson's and General Mills.

Ted Mack was recently honored by TV Forecast Magazine when readers of midwest voted his show the No. 1 network amateur hour, for which he was presented a gold statuette, symbol of the honor.



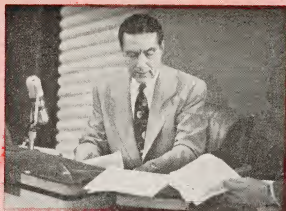

Many of you who watch "Amateur Hour" week after week probably have questions in your mind about the program and how it is conducted. If you don't mind, I would like to prepare this article in the form of question and answer, treating the inquiries that most frequently appear.

How many hopefuls have tried out for "Original Amateur Hour?"

To date, more than 500,000 talented kids have been auditioned by myself and the staff. Of this total, about 10,000 merited further encouragement, and approximately 500 are now in some permanent part of show business.

How does one get a tryout for "Original Amateur Hour?"

Just write to Ted Mack, c/o Box 191, Radio City Station, New York, N. Y. Your letter will be processed, and a date will be set for your audition the next time one of our three travel troupes visits Chicagoland. All letters will be acknowledged.

"How much talent does a hopeful aspirant need?"

Actually, it takes more than talent to become a star. We always look for the natural, inherent ability that is vital to entertainment. For example, a good voice is essential to singers, but what is more important is the way

they put a song over. A skilled dancer should also have that knack of winning the affection of the audience.

By winning on the "Original Amateur Hour," is success assured?

Not at all, although the aspirant may be considered on his way. Show business is difficult for the beginner, and it takes long hours of practice to acquire the kind of skill that makes a top entertainer.

What is the greatest problem for beginners?

Stage fright. I've been in this business all my life, and know what these kids are up against. We try to put them at their ease as much as possible by not rushing their acts.

Is TV a better medium than radio for new acts?

Even though TV presents many more technical problems, it offers many types of acts a greater opportunity through the visual medium—such as jugglers and dancers who must be seen to be appreciated.

"Has the Original Amateur Hour produced any bigtime stars?"

To name a few, Jack Carter, Robert Merrill, Frank Sinatra, Ray Malone, Paul Winchell, Monica Lewis and Vera Ellen. Why not watch next Tuesday and see the top notch entertainers of tomorrow?

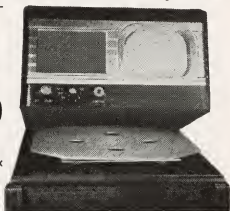

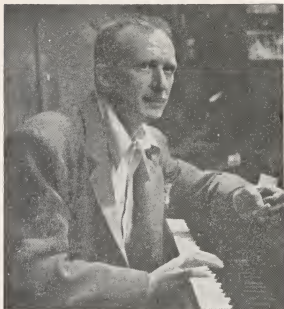

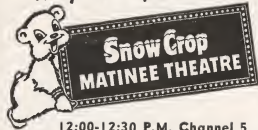

We heard such sayings as "dolly in one" superimpose (now you know what that is) "two," "dolly out one" and so forth and on a television screen in the control room I could see the scene that was taking place just as you would see it on your screens.

If the picture is bad or if the shots don't look right, the director does the scene over until it's right, but once the show is on the air, there can be no changes. So now you know why the director is the busiest bee you ever saw.

He stands, he sits; he yells, he sighs; he tears his hair, or puts on a hat; and generally doesn't calm down until the show is over.

Prediction: Show of Shows to Flop . . .

by JACK MABLEY

Frank Sinatra Show: Gets better and better (assuming you like straight variety, which most of us do). I'm going out on a limb and predict it will surpass the Show of Shows in popularity unless Sid and Imogene find some new material.

What's Your Trouble: A late evening show on WBKB, which brings radio emcee Mal Bellairs to television. The idea of the show isn't sensational, but Mr. Bellairs looks like he'll be around TV for a long time.

The Kefauver hearings: They're past history now, of course, but their influence on television will be felt for a long time. The stations which carried the hearings added tremendously to their prestige and good will.

You can expect a new attitude toward televising important news events, and particularly Congressional investigations. Televising a news event as it occurs is probably television's greatest strength, and they have been slow to realize it. The Kefauver business gave them a pretty broad hint.

Parade of Bands: Each band will stick around for four consecutive shows from now on. This is another good variety program, somewhat underrated because it competes with the Fireside Theater.

TV Garden Club: You won't get a great deal of entertainment out of this show, but you'll get a lot of information about gardening.

Comedy Hour: The Bea Lillie show, you may recall, ran long, and Miss Lillie was cut off just as she started to make her final talk. It is amazing that a sponsor will spend \$100,000 on an hour, and not have the foresight to put in some elasticity toward the end so that it can be cut or lengthened to make it come out on time. The snipped-off endings often ruin the memory of an otherwise excellent show.

Zoo Parade: News here in that it has had one of the most phenomenal rating climbs in television. Starting with a 5.0 rating last fall, it is now around 20.0 nationally, is over 30.0 in

Chicago. That makes it one of the top 10 shows in Chicago.

Showtime, USA: Consistently gets the top talent in the entertainment world, and *never* has clicked. I think the blame belongs with Vinton Freedly, the emcee, who happens to be president of an actors' group, and simply doesn't have the personality for holding a TV show together.

Fred Waring: Another show that is growing in stature every week. Their new method of blending from one song into another is a great advancement. And don't you like Keith and Sylvia Textor, two of the old Honeydreamers who got their start in Chicago?

Miss Susan: Daytime viewers report this job is every bit as miserable as radio's soap operas. I guess that's about as nasty a crack as you could make about it.

All-Chicago Talent Plan Cancer Show

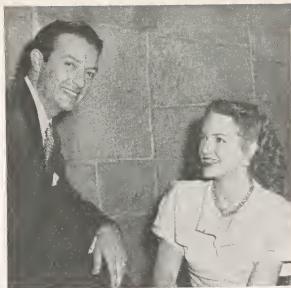

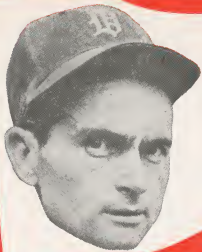

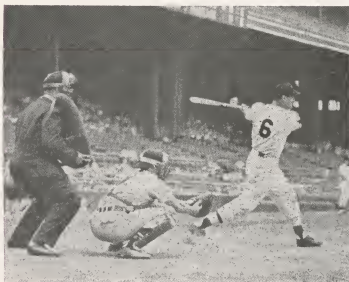
Of course, these pre-season predictions can be altered considerably by injuries and then, too, no one can be certain of the manpower situation.

Frankly, I feel we have strengthened ourselves with the addition of Dobson,

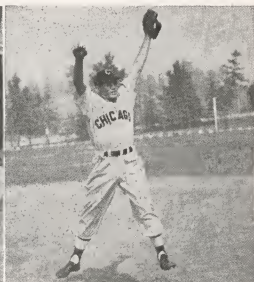
Littlefield and Zarilla in the recent trade with Boston. Zarilla was the key man in the deal and Al can supply the punch we were lacking last season.

I'm confident that our youth movement is going to begin to pay dividends for Chicago's baseball fans. Therefore, at the risk of going out on the limb, I'm predicting a first division finish for my Chicago Cubs this year.

A lot of us did a lot of suffering last year watching our kids make mistakes. But we refused to get jittery with these young fellows and their in-

experience, and when it was all over we were in 7th place—out of the cellar anyhow—and we had that big year of experience under our belts.

Now, world conditions permitting, we'll have one of the youngest infields in baseball performing on the North Side, and performing well. And look at their ages!

Wayne Terwilliger, 25, second base; Roy Smalley, 24, shortstop, and Bill Serena, 26, or Ransom Jackson, 24, at third base. They're all kids, but they've

Majeski, who led the team with a .309 average last year, and Floyd Baker, a stellar defensive third baseman, will battle it out for the "hot corner" assignment, as will Nelson Fox and Al Kozar at second base. Eddie Robinson has the inside track on the first base job due to his power.

The catching will be in the very capable hands of Phil Masi and Gus Niarhos and the hottest battle for a starting role can result behind the plate.

Then there's Frank Hiller, Paul Minner and Walt Dubiel among the holdovers.

I believe quite a few of our new pitchers have a chance to make the grade this year. Southpaw Bob Schultz is up from Nashville, where he had a 25-6 record and was chosen most valuable player in the league. Cal McLish, 20-11 at Los Angeles, is back for another chance.

We lost a fine young catcher in Carl Sawatski, truly a great power hitter, to the army, but we still have Mickey Owen, Al Walker and Forrest Burgess behind the plate. So all in all, I'm rather optimistic about 1951.

The Last Word

Now that all of the columnists, comics, and wiseguys have had their say about the Kefauver hearings I'd like to have the last word—a serious word, believe it or not.

Much has been said and printed about the interest of the general public in this sensational attempt to expose organized crime. One phase not emphasized enough is that due to television names like Anastasia, Adonis, Costello, O'Dwyer have become household words. In only a few days these same names have become better known in the east and midwest than all the Berles, Godfreys and Dagmars.

What it amounts to is that a bunch of amateurs have taken over television.

In the old days of Hecht and MacArthur even newspaper headlines on crime and political corruption never attracted so much attention. What it has proved—even to the skeptics—was that television is beginning to prove to even the most doubtful that it has an important part in journalism and can scoop our daily press.

One or two sourgrape columnists and editorialists—presumably under orders—wrote off the Kefauver hearings and their sponsorship by Time magazine. Until we have educator or public service channels, it's my opinion that we owe Time, ABC, and DuMont a thank-you for presenting the program.

Some of our better citizens have suffered because of the Kefauver hearings. For instance, businessman Jim Moran—no relation to the notorious New Yorker who took to the stands during the quiz—was the butt of many jokes.

Such jokes from the mouths of light-headed comedians and humorous take-offs on variety and children's shows did more harm than good. Once a hoodlum suspected he was funny and entertaining his worth to the committee lessened in value. For once our great gift of American humor could have been spared to give all-out support to the few statesmen who feel the country should be aware of corruption.
