Channel One

NEW YORK—Walter Winchell, who like Milton Berle has received a lifetime pact with his network, figures to gross an ever so cool \$650,000 a year. The figure makes the provocative gabber the highest paid man in show business. . . . Movie moguls have devised a plan to test story lines slated for movies through TV first. Idea is novel and will get its initial test when Rosalind Russell will star in "Never Wave at a WAC"—a picture earmarked for the movies. If public reception is good, Roz will do a flicker version. . . . "Dragnet" is definitely set for teeveeing Thursday evenings. Show will be a video version of same night's AM series. . . . CBS, dissatisfied over its Saturday night fare, is planning a complete revamping of its schedule. "Beat the Clock" would be shifted. Faye Emerson's "Wonderful Town" ditto. "My Friend Irma," Sam Levenson, Garry Moore, and maybe Frank Sinatra would be the replacements. . . . Steve Allen said it: "The best place to look for a family circle is around a square meal. . . . Things-are-looking-up dept.: the FCC has been swamped with applications from educational institutions for filling the 250 channels set aside for education only. The soundest propositions will get the nod. . . . CBS is building a show for tenor-comic Dennis Day—along the same lines as the Alan Young offering.

They're still talking about the trick CBS's Arthur Godfrey played on his "Talent Scout" show. The Redhead urged his audience to call Circle 7-8300 for latest World Series scores—that's NBC's number and the operators on the rival network were swamped with calls. They are still recuperating. . . . Following in the video steps of Somerset Maugham, novelist Louis Bromfield is readying a TV series which he will narrate and occasionally script. . . . A filmed series called "Cowboy G-Man" starring the ex-"Kid," Jackie Coogan is ready for shooting. The title sounds like the execs were at loggerheads as to whether the series should be a Western or a mystery—so they compromised. . . . Vivian Blaine (from the original cast of "Guys and Dolls") and Pinky Lee are TV-teaming for a two-a-week fifteen minute slot. . . . Ethel Barrymore, who has been spending most of her acting time in Hollywood in bed, might consent to do "The Corn Is Green" on TV. . . . Roy Rogers is upset over his studio's plan to release his movie pictures for television. The singing cowboy is suing. . . . Laraine Day draws attention to the sign posted in front of a Texas church to notify people that the church was supporting a chicken dinner. The sign read: "Come in for a wing and a prayer."

NBC is considering telecasting a two-hour super show once a month. If the plans come off, you may be treated to a telecast of "South Pacific." . . . President Truman's first coast to coast TV speech had a whopping 50.5 Nielsen rating. . . . The touchy problem of allowing laxative sponsors on TV is being weighed by the four major nets. . . . NBC is readying a fully-scored daily newsreel, the first of its kind to compete directly with theatrical newsreels. . . . Perry Como, star of his own CBS-TV show, never had a singing lesson in his life. . . . Abbott and Costello turned down an offer of more than a million and a quarter dollars for a 39 week series on TV. Their reason: they can get more from the movies.

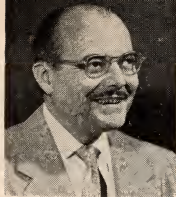

HE CAN'T CONTROL THE GUESTS



WHEN ABC-TV's "Super Circus" celebrated its third telecasting anniversary recently, producer Phil Patton and his cast members looked back on some exciting video moments that few shows can parallel.

And these moments can mostly be attributed to active fur-bearing performers who don't qualify for TVA union cards.

"Super Circus" has depended a great deal on animal acts to fill the guest bill during its three-year history—a fact that has brought the program into national prominence and also brought it some precarious moments.

Like the time producer Patton booked a trained orangutang for the show. The ape forgot his manners while scurrying across the stage on a scooter, picked the two-wheeler up and clobbered musical supervisor Bruce Chase across the brow with it.

Then there was the time that Perri, a trained pelican, was supposed to fly from the balcony to the stage and come to a perfect landing. While in flight, Perri forgot to put down his landing gear and smashed through the "Super Circus" backdrop.

There have been many such little foul-ups. Like the day the camel spit in the stage manager's eye, or the time the dumbest skunk of all time bit Mary Hartline on the finger, or when a monkey ripped out the seat of Ringmaster Claude Kirchner's breeches.

The man who has had to bare the brunt of such misfortunes is the aforementioned Phil Patton.

Patton has been producer on the show since May, 1949, although he remembers the years he spent with Orrin Tucker and Eddy Howard as a drummer.

"I lived two lifetimes in those years

—and learned more about people and the United States than I ever could have any other way," claims Phil.

When Tucker disbanded his organization in 1942 to enter the service, Patton joined Eddy Howard. The following year he became an announcer, director and musician in Davenport, Iowa. In June, 1944, he joined ABC as a producer.

Born November 2, 1910, Phil is nearly six feet tall, has brown eyes, dresses conservatively (for a producer) and has a caustic sense of humor. He is married and has one son—Bardie, who is currently featured as "Scampy, the clown" on "Super Circus."

Patton freely admits that the "Super Circus" show is one of his favorite undertakings—despite the occasional nightmares caused by the animals' antics.

"Super Circus" is seen on channel 7 every Sunday at 4 p.m.

FRANCOIS POPE CREATES GOURMETS

*Even the camera crew
puts on weight*



FRANCOIS POPE, the cooking genius of TV's "Creative Cookery" show on WBKB, is a man who likes to eat. Before Mr. Pope and his two sons entered the TV field, housewives were offered in the way of cooking shows, a lot of "budget" meals supervised by "home economists." Attractive meals were not the aim of these shows—but rather dreary, short-cut methods of economizing on meals. Kitchen gadgets were as important as the meal itself.

Francois Pope decided to do something about the situation. So he brought his years of experience in teaching cooking methods to the TV screen. Result: many housewives are serving better and more delectable meals to their families—and without using gadgets.

Pope, an immediately likeable chef, still possesses a slight accent which comes into play when he almost quaintly refers to his TV viewers as "stewdents." He was born in Paris where at an early age he helped out in his father's cafe. Before reaching 10 years of age, he was a qualified cook.

Mrs. Pope, who is of Italian extraction, also is an expert *chef de cuisine*. She and her husband have conducted a cooking school in Chicago since 1937. Their two sons are experienced cooks in their own right. Frank Jr., 24, and his brother Robert, 22, hold court regularly on the "Creative Cookery" show

helping their father turn out his daily *piece de resistance*.

Pope's "stew-dents" are an intent bunch whose interest in culinary art is obvious by the mail responses the show receives. The number of letters received sometimes reaches as high as a thousand a day.

And who wouldn't be interested in the Pope method when the food subjects are so diversified and delectable each day? Let's take a sample week from Pope's schedule of dishes: Monday—chocolate cream nut fudge, Viennese whip cream nut torte; Tuesday—Chicken cacciatore and Waldorf salad; Wednesday—lamb shiskabab and zucchini squash; Thursday—Bohemian rye bread and cucumbers in sour cream; Friday—shrimp Arnaud and Athenian salad.

If you're not a gourmet, Francois Pope will make you one. In fact, Mr. Pope has operated a male cooking school which proved very popular and successful. "I predict," said the cooking whiz, "that men, under the proper guidance, will prove themselves as well equipped to manipulate the frying pan, mixing bowl, and pastry bag, as the gavel, golf club, and gun."

His male classes drew prominent lawyers, dentists, stock brokers, and other business and professional men who reveled in showing their wives the "correct" way to turn out such feminine specialties as delicate appetizers.

The crew at WBKB can vouch for the delicious meals concocted by Pope. The privileged few who work the show—cameramen and technicians—pounce happily on the freshly prepared dishes just as "Creative Cookery" gives way to its program successor. Imagine the life of a crew member having free lunch daily with Francois Pope while less fortunate workers unwrap their lunch from a foil of wax paper.

"Creative Cookery" has become an indispensable part of many housewives' activities. One homemaker wrote, "I won't answer our telephone between 11 and 12 for fear of missing a part of a recipe. I even told my husband about it and he didn't believe me. He thinks I talk too much."

"Creative Cookery" can be seen each morning Monday through Friday at 11 A.M. to noon on station WBKB.

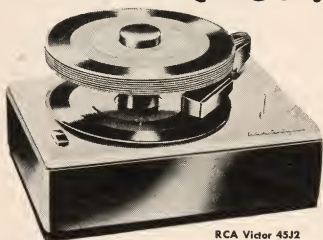

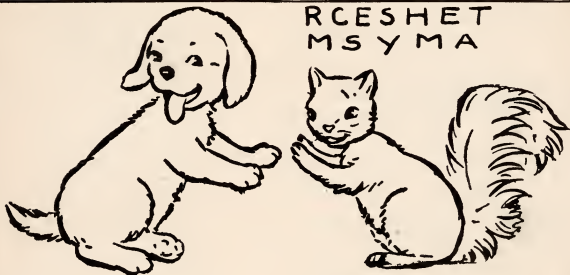

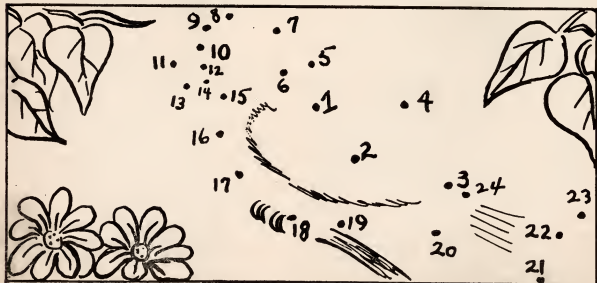

- 1 lb. Nabisco vanilla wafers
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup butter
- 2 cups powdered sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 No. 2 can crushed pineapple
- 1 pt. (2 cups) whipping cream
- 4 tablespoons sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 4-oz. jar maraschino cherries

Put wafers through a food chopper and pat half of crumbs in a large shallow pan. Cream butter and pow-

dered sugar, add eggs and beat well. Spread this mixture over the layer of crumbs. Drain pineapple and lay over creamed mixture. Drain cherries, cut into small pieces and sprinkle over pineapple. (Cherries are optional but add color to the dessert.)

Whip cream, add sugar and vanilla, and spread over fruit. Top dessert by spreading the remainder of the crumbs over the cream.

Chill in refrigerator four to five hours before serving. Cut in squares.

Minute Reviews:

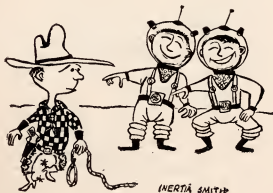
Red Skelton: The week that he came on the air, you saw a headline on this magazine, "Is Red Skelton Really Funny?" Red answered the question very convincingly. I think he is the funniest man on television at the moment. His material is clean, simply presented, and hilarious.

Toast of the Town: Ed Sullivan has been sharp enough to recognize that TV audiences are becoming weary of the old routine vaudeville shows on their screens, and is freshening up Sunday nights with his reviews of the lives of great artists, such as Helen Hayes and Oscar Hammerstein. Ed was ahead of the field with his vaudeville format on Toast, and is leading the pack in breaking away from stereotyped song and dance shows.

Today's Teens: Here is a good new local show in which those fresh, scrubbed-up youngsters kick around their problems. The only trouble is that it comes on Fridays, which I have been told is date night with the kids. This would suggest that the only teens in the audience are those with the real No. 1 Problem—How to get a date.

Amos 'n' Andy: My first enthusiasm for this show is wearing off. It's still a funny program, but it definitely lacks the charm and spark of the radio version. And the complaints that it is unfair in its presentation of colored people certainly are valid.

Creative Cookery: Mr. Pope, my

problem is that I hear a lot around our kitchen about these scrumptious dishes you concoct from 11 to noon every day, but I have yet to taste one. Can you use your persuasive powers to get a little more action and less talk around our ovens?

Chicago Symphony Orchestra: This column's weakness for good music, simply presented, is well established by now. This program is probably the best of the kind on the air. The music is selected with an ear toward pleasing the greatest number of people. The show is an excellent antidote to some of the mush that pollutes the Tuesday night air before the Symphony appears.

Howdy Doody: Our warmest congratulations to the National Television Review Board for declaring this program objectionable for children.

Alan Young: One of the benefits of opening up the coast-to-coast TV network is getting this man and Burns and Allen on live instead of kinescope film. Young is another in a lengthening list of comedians who had so-so success in radio, but are hitting the top in television because their humor is so largely visual.

Hail the Champ: Very noisy show. So are the kids it is aimed at, so if your youngsters turn it on, just figure on a half hour of mayhem in your house.

Sammy Kaye Show: As I remember it, this band came into existence as a rather cheesy imitation of Kay Kyser's band, even down to the similarity in names. The word for their television show is ordinary.

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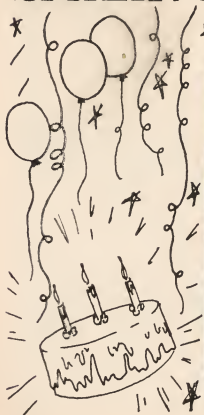

TV Perks Up Big Ten Grid Attendance!

THE initial test of the NCAA television experiment of controlled video has brought about some interesting figures, most of which are highly in the favor of the pro-TV school. Our argument that TV may hurt the gate because of its novel aspect to new owners is being substantiated by the NCAA test. Fans exposed to TV for the first time get such a kick out of the contraption that everything else is forgotten for at least three to six months. Kids don't do homework, Mom burns shirts while ironing, and Dad dominates the couch for the best view.

What has this got to do with the NCAA experiment? Frankly everything. The first test came with the Illini-Wisconsin game. Everything pointed to a poor gate according to TV skeptics.

The game was plugged all week long by NBC-TV. The World Series telecasts became serious competition and what's more—the day of the game was chilly drizzling rain, and made for a miserable day to leave the house. Who in his right mind would leave the comfort of his living room to drive out to Champaign, Ill. when he can watch the World Series and the Illini-Badger game on TV?

Now if Mr. Kenneth L. "Tug" Wilson, Big Ten Commissioner, will take note I'd like to point out some interesting figures. Despite the weather, World Series, and video, the televised version of Illinois-Wisconsin game last week drew 2,277 more people than last year's contest without TV! Some 56,207 people passed through the turnstiles at last week's contest. *In 1950, playing under similar adverse conditions without free home television, 53,930 fans turned out. That's 2,277 fewer spectators!*

This Saturday, Oct. 20, WNBQ will televise the Ohio State-Indiana game under NCAA supervision. Attendance at this game will be scrutinized as well

as the next five consecutive Saturdays to determine video's effect on the gate.

The blazing action of the Chicago Westerners rolling against the New York Chiefs directly from the Chicago Coliseum will be telecast by WGN-TV for three consecutive Sundays: Oct. 28, Nov. 4, and Nov. 11. . . . The Roller Derby can be seen nightly, starting Oct. 23 through Nov. 18, with matinees Sundays only at the Coliseum.

The Chicago Blackhawks are undergoing a complete change of heart—about TV. Bill Tobin, Blackhawks' president, raised many an eyebrow among video circles by announcing: *"The fans have persistently requested TV, so we'll try to give it to them. Television is here to stay and we might as well learn to live with it."*

IN this day of unusual occupations one that would doubtless stand any test of credibility and uniqueness would be that claimed legitimately by Wayne Griffin, he of the Griffin grunt and groan description agency.

Actually, it's a simple matter of a guy with good intentions starting out on the road to study engineering and ultimately changing his mind in favor of a young and limber profession called announcing and all along the line remembering and utilizing his background to further his purposes as an announcer.

Back somewhere in the 30's, Griffin entered college at Stout Institute of Menomonie, Wisconsin, to study engineering. While in school he developed an interest in dramatics and speech and began actively participating in public speaking. One of his instructors, so impressed by Griff's glib tiffs with the syllables, had even predicted a career associated with speech and had suggested that she would hear him on radio someday.

Spurred by this academic accolade and confident of his ability to wrestle two full-time occupations, Griff divided



his time in school between engineering and dramatics (including radio). The net result after three years of college was a record of having acting leads in every collegiate play produced in school and the realization that despite the grand reputation accorded engineering, there was more money to be made with a mike than a micrometer.

Armed to the teeth with education

and a dramatic background, Griffin headed for the big town, finally settling for St. Paul and a staff announcer's position with station WMIN.

However with the sterner and more rigid tasks also came moments of professional pleasure and Griff was accorded such a privilege when he was assigned to cover the weekly mud wrestling bouts in the local arena. This consisted of describing the antics of six mud mellowed mulligans grappling in a ring of mud, with Griff stationed immediately outside the ring apron, adorned in a fireman's coat and helmet (easy to wash the mud off) and with a special talent for dodging huge globs of mud that might escape their mark in the ring. During this period, Griff suffered only one casualty, that coming when one of said globs smacked him full in the face. It was Griffin's first taste of wrestling announcing.

In 1937, Griffin moved a step closer to the big time when he accepted a position as replacement announcer with station KFYZ in Bismarck, North Dakota. While in Bismarck, Griff was introduced to still another facet of the entertainment business, this to have a profound effect on his present style of wrestling and straight announcing style. He became a rodeo announcer.

As such, Griff identified the riders as they entered the arena and announced their times and treatment in all rodeo events including bull-dogging, wild steer roping, trick riding and bronco busting. Griffin went to the full hilt in his effort to become a full-fledged cowboy announcer and demonstrated remarkable techniques in assisting in the digging of the huge barbeque pits of the various rodeo towns, calling square dancing and playing an instrument during the parade following the rodeo.

THE RASSLIN' ENGINEER

Having studied several musical instruments during his pre-college days, including the clarinet, piano, sax, trumpet and drums, Griff was not reluctant to favor his chapped friends with his musical artistry.

Griffin joined station WENR and the Blue Network in 1942, two years after marrying a lass he met during one of his rodeo ventures. His first announcing job at the Blue Network required "chasing dance remotes."

Followed a brief spell as emcee of the National Farm and Home Hour and in the spring of 1943 announcing and emceeing the Victory Parade of Spotlight Bands from Army camps throughout the country.

Of his experiences with the Spotlight Bands, Griff says: "If you've ever tried to load 480 pounds of equipment on a train in less than two minutes, or drive 170 miles through a snowstorm in four hours, and travel more than 600,000 miles in three and a half years, then

you'll have a pretty good idea of the kind of a job we had."

After the Spotlight Bands period, Griff free-lanced, landing several interesting jobs, one of the most notable requiring his serving as a home counsellor on a show called, "Wanted, A Place To Live."

But in the fall of 1948, when ABC began telecasting its Rainbo Wrestling matches, Griff got the announcer's chore and he's been in his "foxhole" beneath the ring ever since. From there on in, fans of Wayne Griffin know the story.

Unlike most wrestlers—and announcers—Griff has no intentions of entering politics. "Several persons have suggested my going into Pennsylvania to run for Governor—claim I'd be a cinch," says Griff with a chuckle, "but other folks have made other suggestions, too, and I can't heed them all. It might embarrass my family."

But of his current existence Griff has no complaints. It's a good life, he admits, and his only problem besides paying the mortgage on his new home in Evanston is trying to figure out how an engineer ever got to be a wrestling announcer.

Wayne as he appears today with his wife, Fran, and daughter Kathy. He devotes most of his free time working at his favorite hobby of photography. Mrs. Griffin on the other hand is most adept in the kitchen and offers TV FORECAST readers one of her best recipes on page 23 of this issue.

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
